

Proverbs 30:1-14

Verses 2-4 - Dr. Ryrie states that “Agur reflects on man’s inability to comprehend the infinite God.” Here, like the book of Job, the writer declares there are many things yet to be revealed about the knowledge of the Holy.

What is progressive revelation? How is that observed comparing this passage and Matthew 1: 18-25 ?

Verses 5 and 6- The Bible is God’s pure Word!
